- 2 services In conversation with Worship, Growing Together Task Force, Mark, and Chela, we are continuing to make adjustments. Overall, the move has been a tremendous success. There have been no significant setbacks and there has been lots of positive feedback.
- Clergy group I am having one-to-one conversations to gather commitments from the local progressive clergy to formalize a working relational group.
- Women's Retreat Gratitude to Chela and the team for creating a very successful offering.
- SFG UUA President Rev. Susan Fredrick Gray visited our congregation along with Annual Giving Director, Rev. Vail Weller. With a congregant, I offered them a tour and hospitality.
- Anti-Racist, Feminist White Male Clergy study group I am taking part in a threesession workshop that is facilitated for white male clergy to explore and work with issues of race and gender.
- Ordination I flew back to Pittsburgh to speak at the ordination of John Balance. Conveniently tucked in between a member wedding here on Friday night and church on Sunday morning. It was a full and eventful weekend.
- Social Justice Collaboration Alongside Larry Price, we gathered the lay leaders of other local church social justice teams. The meeting was fruitful for first steps and warranted a follow up.
- ISN The Immigrant Solidarity Network is making a push for awareness on Measure 105. I will be inviting this conversation next Sunday.
