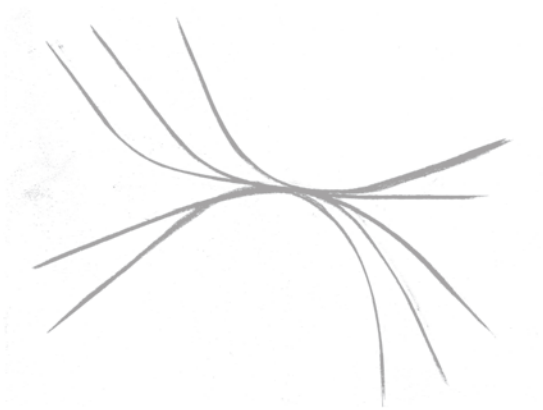

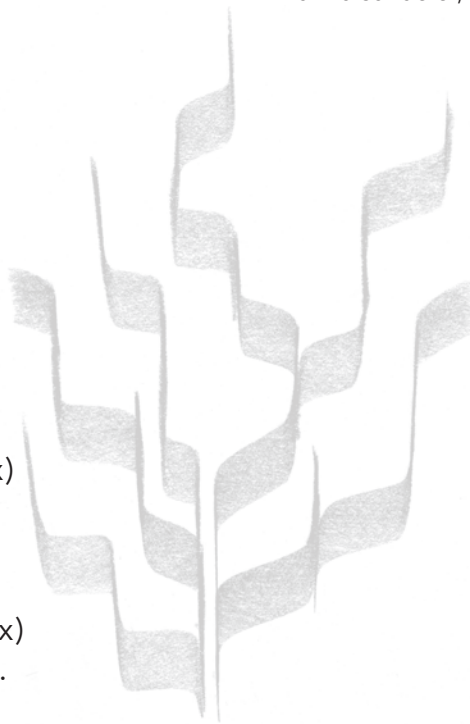

May your new home rest gently upon the earth.

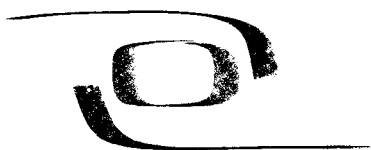
May it ever embrace a community of love.

BRIEF HISTORY

1958-1965: Early Years—In 1958 a small group of families who wanted a religious education alternative for their children founded our Fellowship. They met in homes and very briefly owned the former Grace Baptist Church.

1966-1986 Social Activism—Membership grew to 40 members in the early 1970s. Lay leadership was supported by faculty from Central Oregon Community College and guest speakers. The Kingdom Hall building was purchased and renovated, but sold due to financial considerations.



1987-1999: Surviving on the Edge—Membership declined sharply reaching a crisis in 1987. Five active members decided to persevere in spite of pressure to abandon the Fellowship. By 1999 the revitalized group numbered 32 members and engaged visiting ministers for Sunday services.

2000-2015: Growth and Professional Leadership—Population growth brought new resources to the church.

Moves were made from the Environmental Center, to the Community Center, to the Old Stone Church. In 2004, Rev. Jeanne Pupke was hired part-time as our first minister. Membership increased to 125. Rev. Heather Starr became the Fellowship's first settled minister in 2006, and later our first full-time minister, providing pastoral stability and leadership establishing UUFCO as a primary liberal religious organization in Central Oregon. Rev. Alex Holt served as interim minister 2012-2014, during our focus on the new home project. Rev. Antonia Won joined UUFCO in 2014.

New Home Project Timeline

August/September 2011: Offer of lead gift for a new building. Leslie Koc named head of Steering Committee.

October 2011: Steering Committee formed. Land search commences. Visits to other churches, buildings, and UU fellowships begin. Feasibility study.

November 2011: Visioning workshop with Aggie Sweeney. Sub-committees and workgroups began forming.

December 2011: 22-acre parcel identified. (Approved by congregation in February and deeded to UUFCO in May 2012.)

March/April 2012: Programming and feasibility workshop with Soderstrom Architects. Sustainability Workshop with ML Vidas. Financial Feasibility Study.

May 2012: Unanimous vote of 90% of congregation to move ahead. Architect search begins.

June 2012: Land Blessing

September 2012: THA Architecture hired and design workshops and congregational meetings begin.

October 2012: Michael Marino, Owner's Rep, engaged.

November 2012: Kirby Nagelhout Construction contracted.

April 2013: Capital Campaign exceeds expectations.

September 13, 2013: Groundbreaking

February 1, 2015: First Service

April 26, 2015: Building Dedication

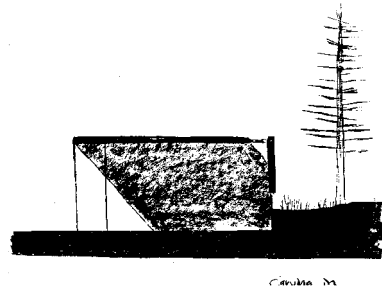
REFLECTIONS

UUFCO was fortunate to be offered a lead gift that allowed us to dream about building a place of our own. In 2010, events had aligned for the lead family that made such generosity possible. As a member of that family, I wrote to the board in September 2011, making an official proposal. They were cautious, wanting to know our intent and vision. What would a new building look like? What would it enable us to do?

The family made it clear that this was to be a full congregation endeavor—a totally inclusive process. The building the congregation created together would reflect its values, reason for being, and place in the greater community. The congregation would develop a shared vision, exploring needs, wishes, and dreams. The intention was that everyone in the Fellowship would feel ownership of our new home.

The thrilling thing today is that we actually have a building that fits the vision. It's real! It is in harmony with the land, warm and inviting, universally accessible, sustainable and energy-efficient, of natural materials, with plenty of light. We have spaces now for children and adults that inspire curiosity and lifelong learning. We have sufficient space now for programs we've yearned for. We are already beginning to see the level of activity burgeoning.

There have been congregants and others who questioned whether this building was the best use of a windfall. From the beginning we wanted this space to be an asset to the greater

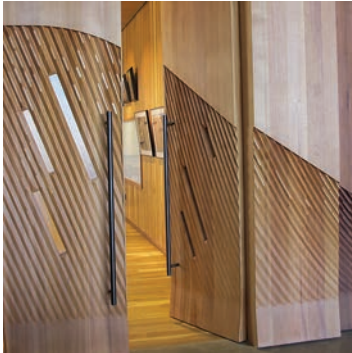


community. It was our belief, and that of most people we spoke with within UUA and UUFCO, that building a beautiful place where people wanted to come, and being open and welcoming to all, would invite connections with the greater community and allow us to be more responsive to its needs. This spirit benefits both UUFCO and Central Oregon in the long term in ways that we haven't yet fully realized.

True to UU form, there were strong and varied opinions. There were constraints and compromises and not all wishes were fulfilled. But the process was inclusive, and now this place belongs to us all. I hope that we embrace it with joy and enthusiasm, as a way to grow together and move forward on our spiritual journeys.

Thank you to everyone who was a part of this project, and to all who have brought fresh energy since we entered the doors into this new era for our Fellowship.

DESIGNING OUR NEW HOME

Corey Martin, THA Architecture, Project Designer

When designing the new home we set out to ask questions that could help us find the form for the building. Among these questions a few rose to the top as the most important.

The first question – “How can Unitarian Universalist principles inform the geometry of the design?” – pushed us to find the forms that embodied the ideals of inclusiveness, exploration, and community. The charcoal sketches throughout this program were done as a meditation on these ideas, searching for fundamental forms that could inspire the floor plan arrangement and sectional design of the spaces.

The next question – “How can the natural processes of Central Oregon inform the design?” – came from the reverence that the entire design team has for the region. We looked at the dynamic processes of creation and erosion in the volcanic landscape and the resulting forms of rock, topography and qualities of material in the region. From this, the fundamental concept that the building could embody these processes in its form, appearance and materiality emerged. Every aspect of the design has a specific story about its relationship to this idea, from the stone walls to the forms and shapes of the building to the way the exterior siding was designed. The result is a building that moves, that feels like it is undergoing a process of creation and erosion.

ASPIRATIONS FOR OUR NEW HOME

In 2012, the vision of the congregation was distilled into 14 basic aspirations. These were the guiding principles for our architects, design committee and others throughout the project. Our building would have these qualities:

warm, inviting, and welcoming
nourish our spirituality
support connections within our congregation
encourage life-long discovery, curiosity, and creativity
respectful of and connected to nature
imbued with natural light and fresh air
demonstrate meaningful sustainability
gracefully adapt to our growth
enduring and easy to maintain
highly functional and universally accessible
maximize value within our resources
serve our greater community
reflect Unitarian Universalist principles
simple, elegant, beautiful, and timeless

Over one hundred members and friends participated in visioning and sustainability workshops, workgroups, and task forces. We focused on what we wanted and needed in our new home, and how our building would function.

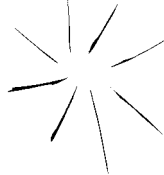
